


	<b>Good:</b> D-rings on frames do not protrude far, so are unlikely to damage other paintings during handling.		<b>Not acceptable:</b> The protruding screw-eye can scratch other frames and dent canvases as pictures are handled.
	<b>Good:</b> Framing points covered with framing tape. Not only covers sharp edges but keeps pesky insects out!		<b>Not acceptable:</b> Cover them up!
	<b>Good:</b> D-rings are fine on the back of box canvases.		<b>Good:</b> Screw eyes are fine on the inner surfaces of a box canvas as they don't protrude.
	<b>Good:</b> Edge of painting extends around side of box canvas.		<b>Good:</b> Edge of box canvas neatly painted.
		<b>Use Framing Tape or Gum Strip</b> to seal the backs of framed work. Avoid using masking tape, as in a year or so the glue will dry up and it will probably fall off, and for the same reason don't use Sellotape!
